

### School Lottery Closes on February 23

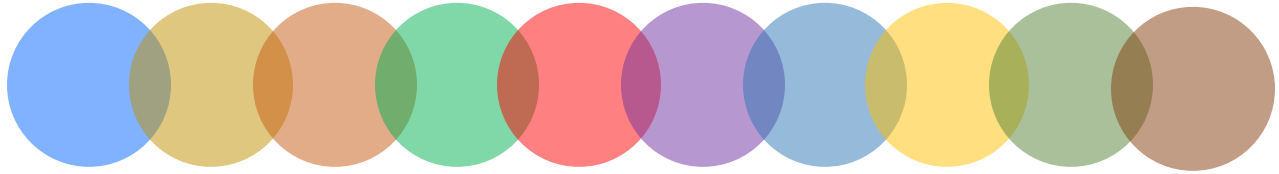
Please encourage friends or neighbors to enroll in our lottery if they have an interest in joining our fabulous Montessori school family next year. The deadline to apply is February 23.

**Mr. DeVold's Notes**



School funding is a hot topic for our community; most people have a view about how well our schools are funded. As a school principal, this issue is always an influencing factor in making decisions. While I do not support any particular view on this matter, I do encourage our school community to participate in the budgeting process that is headed up by our district. As a charter school, we do enjoy a bit of freedom in the use of our funds in purchasing curricular materials and allocating funds to provide for our Montessori approach to instruction. However, we are affected by state and borough decisions regarding funding. We are affected by district decisions on budgeting for supplies and materials, custodial coverage, and certified staffing decisions. My hope is that our families are aware of the district efforts to communicate with the public about school funding. I appreciate seeing our school represented by parents at these in-person and online events. Your participation not only provides you with important district information that can affect your child's education, it also allows you to share your understanding with others and include your voice in the decision making process.

**Montessori & School Program Notes**

Teachers educated in the Montessori Method bring distinctive skills to the task. Their quiet orchestrations lead to magical moments as young children exclaim "I learned it myself!"—and older students think it. Called a "directress" by Montessori Method founder Dr. Maria Montessori, and sometimes known as a "guide," the Montessori teacher plays many roles as he or she directs, or guides, his or her students. Through careful observation, the Montessori teacher comes to know each student's interests, learning style, and temperament. The teacher understands the student's developmental needs and is receptive to the "sensitive periods," when the student is most ready to learn a new concept or skill. With this information, the teacher chooses materials and lessons that will capture the student's attention and entice them to learn. When it is observed that the student has mastered a concept or skill, the teacher introduces new lessons that become increasingly complex and abstract.
